# Steps in Planning for Your Wedding

#### 1. Set the Date and Reserve the Church

As you first begin making wedding plans be sure to check on the availability of the church and the pastor. In order to reserve the church you will need to fill out and return a Wedding Information Sheet along with a \$200 deposit. It is still early in the planning process and you may not be able to complete the entire information sheet. Simply fill out the parts you are able to complete. You will have the chance to amend it as your planning progresses.

#### 2. Arrange for Marriage Preparation

Marriage is a big and important step in your life. We believe that premarriage care is an important part of preparing for your married life together, therefore Atonement requires couples to attend a pre-marriage workshop or arrange counseling with a pastor or certified counselor. You have multiple options for pre-marriage counseling. Please consult a pastor before scheduling yours.

#### 3. Meet With our Wedding Coordinator

Atonement's Wedding Coordinator, Melissa Blommel, will be a great help in planning the day, answering questions, and ensuring that your wedding runs smoothly. The Wedding Coordinator is your first point of contact regarding decorating, schedules (rehearsal and photographs, for example), and other details. She is available by phone at 320 237 1870.

#### 4. Contact Musician(s)

Secure the organist and/or special music early. The church Office Administrator and Wedding Coordinator have the names and phone numbers of Atonement's musicians. Fees may vary based on what kind of music you want and are paid directly to the musician by the couple. Preservice, processional, recessional, and post service music are all very important to the quality of the event. Special music such as solos and congregational singing can also add to the day. Guest musicians must be approved by the Atonement Director of Music Ministries.

#### 5. Plan Service with Pastor

Two or three months before the ceremony you will meet with the pastor who will officiate your wedding. Details of this meeting are on the following pages.

### Planning the Wedding Ceremony

A wedding is a worship service. The officiating pastor will help you plan the ceremony and will work with you to make the ceremony personal and meaningful. The officiating pastor has final say on all aspects of the wedding ceremony.

### Wedding Bulletins

Couples are encouraged to use their creativity to design and produce their own bulletins to uniquely express their thoughts and personalities. Layout and printing is the responsibility of the couple.

### Candles

The church has a 14-light candelabra set available for your use. A unity candle or unity sand may be used; all materials must be provided by the couple. Consult with the Wedding Coordinator regarding recommended types and sizes of candles.

#### Paraments

Altar and banner hangings change with the season of the church year: Advent - blue; Lent – purple; Christmas and Easter – white; Ephipany & Time after Pentecost – green. There are also select Holy Days that use red. Aisle runners are not used.

# Pictures

Professional photographs may be taken either before or after the service, but it is Atonement's recommendation that all photographs be done before the ceremony. Please check with the pastor or Wedding Coordinator for the best time. Video recording is permitted. For best results video equipment should be set up in the balcony.

### Rehearsal

A rehearsal makes it more likely that the wedding day goes smoothly. Rehearsals are typically held the evening before the wedding and take 30 to 60 minutes. Those attending should include the wedding party, parents of the couple, ushers, readers, musicians, soloists, and others with a significant role in the ceremony. The officiating pastor and wedding coordinator will conduct the rehearsal.

### Marriage License

Marriage licenses are available through the county clerk's office. You will need an ID. Divorcees will also need a copy of divorce decree. Widows/ widowers will need the date of spouse's death. The county will mail you the license. Remember to bring the license to the church before or at the time of the rehearsal and day of the wedding. Completing pre-marriage counseling grants a discount of the cost of the license.

# Final Details

- > \$200.00 down payment is required to reserve your date.
- Atonement's Sanctuary seats 150 to 300, depending on altar and seating alignment.
- $\succ$  The entire building is air-conditioned.
- $\succ$  Neither rice nor bird seed may be used.
- $\succ$  Alcohol is not allowed in the church or on the church grounds.

#### Costs
