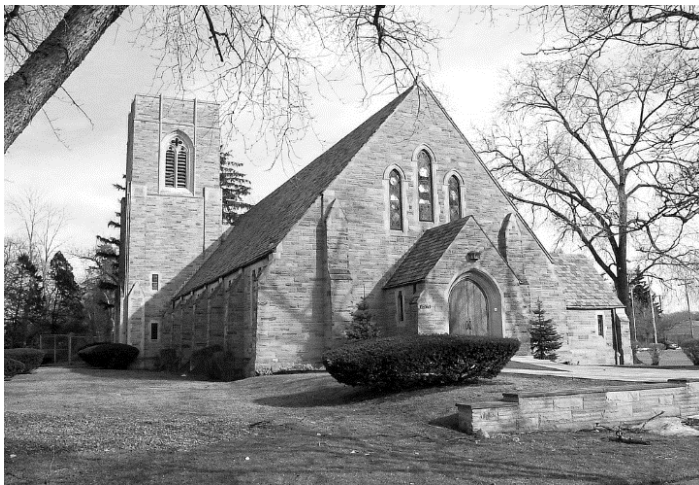

A NOTE FROM THE PASTORS

Loved into the Church as a Child...

Be careful, the Atonement program year is about to begin and you ought to be aware that loving kids at church has long-term effects. You might make an impression on a child that changes their life decades from now!



Whenever the beginning of a program year starts at church, I think about my childhood church and give thanks to the people who nurtured my faith. The picture to the right is Rosedale Park Lutheran Church. I attended the church as an elementary age child. It was a small neighborhood LCMS Lutheran church in the big city of Detroit MI. My family attended this church because we could walk there. On Sunday mornings, my godmother, Delores Gall, would stop on her way to church to pick me up along with my two sisters. Delores drove a convertible

and it was a cool ride in the summer and an even cooler ride in the winter for the mile drive to church.

Delores is seated on the left next to my paternal Grandma Vera (my daughter's namesake) in the ancient picture to the right. In addition to being my godmother, Delores was my first cousin once removed – i.e. my grandma's niece.

What was remarkable about Rosedale Park Lutheran Church was the tenacity with which they loved children. The average age in this church was somewhere close to retirement or beyond. There were only 4-5 families with children left in the congregation. Some of the families did not attend worship every week. What can a congregation do when this happens?



The approach that Rosedale Park Lutheran took was to reach out to children to whom they knew and bring them to church. They also figured out how to love those kids. The old folks organized Sunday school and managed to love those kids that came, even the

rambunctious ones like me! I was treated like a prince. Everybody knew my name. All the adults talked to me!

My godmother Delores was my Sunday school teacher for years. Her children were all grown-up, (I remember her daughter babysat me a few times and I terrorized her), but she was committed to sharing the faith with me and other children. I knew that Delores loved me, and church was a place where I was loved. I wish I could share all the lessons I learned there, but what is truly remarkable is that I remember exactly one story that Delores taught me.

The story was based on Matthew 18:6 – *“If any of you put a stumbling-block before one of these little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you if a great millstone were fastened around your neck and you were drowned in the depth of the sea.”* Along with the story, I drew a picture that I can still see in my “mind’s eye.” It was a huge millstone tied to the neck of a stick figure sinking into the sea. I was very proud of this picture, despite my grade school artistic talent. This story freed and empowered me in ways that I still do not fully understand.

I am thankful for the love that I received at Rosedale Park Lutheran church and for the effort that the adults who attended there made on my behalf. My godmother loved me and welcomed me into church where everybody knew my name! Later in life, I was able to write my godmother and thank her for helping me understand God’s love for me and for being one who helped lead me into seminary.

If you’d like to make a difference in the life of a child, I invite you to consider volunteering for the Atonement Wednesday faith formation program. It’s a “full meal deal” – in one evening, you can get a meal, worship, and the opportunity to influence the development of a child at an age of your choosing. The elementary age youth have faith formation before Wednesday Worship and the 6th-9th grade youth have confirmation after Wednesday Worship. Adults are invited to participate in either group. Sadly, Rosedale Park Lutheran closed in 1982, (the year I graduated from high school) after 54 years of ministry to a particular neighborhood. They never figured out how to integrate the congregation as the racial profile of the neighborhood changed and its founding members moved to the suburbs. Soon after they closed, the building was sold to a black Baptist congregation, and it quickly thrived again as a place that proclaimed the good news of the gospel!

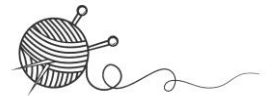
PET BLESSING SERVICE: Sunday, September 15th, 10am

A LETTER FROM THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

The 2024 Stewardship Campaign has begun. Our Stewardship Team will be active between the end of August through Consecration Sunday on November 24, 2024.

This year our theme is "Share the Gift of God". We are relying upon four major premises supported by scripture:

- It is important to graciously receive.
- It is important to graciously give.
- God is the beginning of receiving and giving.
- We receive gifts from God and then we share those gifts with others.



As Paul wrote to the church in Corinth:

Each of you must give according to as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work. II Corinthians 9:7-8

Over the next few months, the Stewardship Team will be putting up posters, writing articles in the newsletter, and providing updates on the Church's website regarding various opportunities provided by our church based upon your gifts to the General Fund. We plan to continue using our Confirmation of Attendance cards and our Estimate of Giving cards. We also plan to have a brunch following the Consecration Sunday service. There will be a few changes, however. We will not be presenting temple talks in November, and our Attendance, and Giving cards will be colored primarily in yellow and green as will our posters. This will help distinguish your gifts to the General Fund for budgeted items such as worship, education, fellowship, property, mission, and youth, from your gifts to the Capital Campaign and your gifts to specific unbudgeted items, such as Mission of the Month.

The church council has asked the Stewardship Team to specifically distinguish pledged gifts to the General Fund as part of our annual Stewardship Campaign from pledged gifts to the Capital Campaign. Both campaigns are important. However, they have different goals. As noted above, General Fund pledges are used to help us establish our annual church budget. The Capital Campaign has two goals. The first goal is to pay off the mortgage on the church property. If we can do so, it will free up between \$40,000 and \$50,000 per year that are currently coming out of General Fund giving. By paying off the mortgage, it will be possible to either have more funds for programs, staff, etc., or it would make it possible to reduce the annual budget.

The second goal of the Capital Campaign is to have funds available for paying street improvement assessments that we know will be charged within the next several years. It is not certain when the street improvements will be made.

Capital Campaign giving, like paying off any debt is premised on "taking care of our own house" and reducing risk. Significant Capital Campaign gifts and pledges have already been made by our congregation, with a pending request for additional pledges planned for September, 2024. The main color for the Capital Campaign pledge cards is purple. This will distinguish the Capital Campaign pledge cards from the General Fund pledge cards, which are yellow and green.

Strategic donations of medical supplies and equipment are both sustaining and capacity-building. In resource-poor settings many patients can't pay, and healthcare systems are often crippled by a lack of equipment and supplies. GHM's supply chain is a lifeline for mission hospitals and clinics that struggle to provide healthcare to some of the world's most vulnerable people. Donated overstock and unused medical supplies from the USA

literally empower medical staff to save lives. Donated equipment, like an x-ray or anesthesia machine, increases the services a health center can provide. It may also make that center eligible for ongoing support from the local government health department.

For the past several years in September, Atonement has supported ELCA World Relief with making hospice kits. These kits consist of a washcloth, bar of soap, toothbrush, pick-style comb, nail clipper, band-aids, vaseline and a pair of rubber dish gloves, These items are then wrapped in a bath towel and tied securely, Marilyn Lisbon coordinates and enlists volunteers to pack these kits and deliver them to the warehouse in Fridley. The trip to the warehouse is set for Thursday, **September 26th**. If interested in packing and/or going to Fridley, please contact Marilyn or Kay Defries.
